Nadine Mukamdayisenge is only 18 years old. In America, 18 is an incredible age with high hopes of college and the freedom to choose who you want to be. Over in Rwanda, Nadine did not get to choose. When she lost both of her parents to AIDS, she was left with two sisters and a brother to care for. Many parents who die from AIDS in Rwanda were given the disease during the genocide from rape or slashes of machetes. Nadine's choices are not about what college to go to or what clothes to wear, but how to put food on the table and provide medical care for the HIV that
